




MEET THE CAST & CREW





SYNOPSIS

PART ONE

Act I

In the prologue, Mortimer reveals his family's suffering under the Lancastrians to his nephew, Richard Plantagenet, and charges him with restoring their honor. In Scene I, the English nobility react to King Henry V's death and troubling news from France. Scene II shows Joan la Pucelle persuading Charles and his allies to continue fighting the English. Scene III features a heated rivalry between Gloucester and Bishop Winchester. Scene IV sees English forces, led by Talbot, defeated by Joan and the French, with Talbot retreating in frustration.

Act II

Joan of Arc celebrates a victory at Orleans and is honored by Charles, while Talbot plans a new assault on the city but faces strong French resistance. Richard Plantagenet and Suffolk clash over power claims in London's Temple Garden, using a rose-plucking contest to symbolize their dispute, which escalates into threats and personal attacks. Warwick predicts the conflict will lead to significant bloodshed.

Act III

In Parliament, Gloucester and Bishop Winchester's conflict turns violent, disrupting London and alarming King Henry VI. The King calls for a truce, and Gloucester supports Richard Plantagenet as Duke of York. Joan, disguised, persuades the Duke of Burgundy to ally with the French, altering the power balance despite an English victory led by Talbot. Act IV

King Henry VI deals with Burgundy's betrayal and appoints York as regent in France. Talbot demands Bordeaux's surrender but faces a standoff. York and Lucy discuss rescuing Talbot, who fights alongside his son but mourns his death. The French, led by Charles and Joan, prepare to advance to Paris after a significant victory.

Act V

King Henry VI and his nobles discuss peace proposals to end the conflict with France, including a marriage alliance with Armagnac's daughter. Cardinal Winchester aims to assert authority over Gloucester. In France, Charles and his allies prepare for battle, while Suffolk captures Margaret, planning to marry her to Henry. Joan, condemned to death, curses her captors before being executed. Suffolk manipulates the political landscape to his advantage.

Act VI

Following Henry VI's marriage to Margaret, the political situation in England becomes turbulent. Gloucester and other nobles are displeased with the peace treaty, and Glouces-

ter faces personal and political challenges. Hume and their allies conduct rituals to influence politics, which York and Buckingham uncover. The instability sets the stage for future conflict.

Act VII

Gloucester faces accusations against his wife, Eleanor Cobham, who is charged with witchcraft and treason. Gloucester resigns his position and distances himself from her. York, Salisbury, and Warwick plot to support York's claim to the throne, while Eleanor is sentenced to exile. Gloucester's wife endures public humiliation and predicts further betrayal.

Act VIII

King Henry VI and his council, including Queen Margaret, Suffolk, and York, deal with Gloucester's absence. Margaret criticizes Gloucester, and Suffolk and York accuse him of treason. Gloucester is arrested despite his protests. York is appointed to handle an Irish rebellion and vows to use it to further his ambitions, planning to stir unrest in England through a rebel named John Cade.

PART TWO

Act I: York anticipates conflict and allies with rebel John Cade, who incites chaos with radical demands. Cade's uprising gains traction, leading to battles against the king's forces and further unrest in London. Meanwhile, York prepares to challenge both the rebels and the king.

Act II: The Duke of York advances on London with a claim to the throne, challenging King Henry VI. York's forces defeat the Lancastrians, including key figures like Clifford, setting the stage for York to press his claim further.

Act III: York occupies Parliament, demanding his claim to the throne be recognized.

A compromise is reached where York will succeed Henry VI, but conflict continues as

Queen Margaret and the Lancastrians respond aggressively. York's eventual defeat and
death escalate the power struggle.

Act IV: Following York's death, Edward IV seeks revenge, and conflicts with Henry VI and his supporters persist. Edward ultimately triumphs and prepares to ascend the throne. Meanwhile, alliances shift, with Margaret seeking French support and Warwick proposing a strategic marriage alliance.

Act V: Edward IV consolidates his power and seeks vengeance for his father's death. As Henry VI flees, Edward plans a marriage to Lady Grey despite opposition. Richard visits Henry VI to seek power. In France, Margaret's attempts to secure support and Warwick's marriage negotiations reflect the ongoing power struggles and shifting alliances.

DIRECTOR'S NOTE:

Our production of Shakespeare's Henry VI trilogy is a bold reimagining that dives headfirst into the raw, chaotic energy of political ambition and civil unrest. We've taken this epic story of England's most tumultuous period and infused it with a modern, punk rock aesthetic to reflect the urgency and relevance of these timeless themes. "Henry VI" is not just a historical narrative; it's a visceral exploration of the monstrous nature of power and the brutal consequences of unchecked ambition. In bringing this trilogy to life, we've faced the immense challenge of condensing Shakespeare's 8,759 lines across three plays into two action-packed performances, each running around 2.5 hours. This meant cutting and reshaping the material and reimagining how to convey the story's grand scale and intense emotion. We've leaned into the over-the-top nature of the original text, embracing its cinematic quality by creating a visually dynamic reenactment of brutality.

Our vision for the show is rooted in the idea that history is theater, and theater can be prophecy. The set design, with its crumbling structures and skewed angles, reflects the distorted and unstable political landscape, mirroring the disintegration of the English empire and the moral decay of its leaders. This crumbling world is underscored by a soundtrack of anarchic British punk music, featuring bands like The Clash and The Sex Pistols to harness the play's rebellious, chaotic spirit.

We've also incorporated massive "death puppets" operated by multiple actors, broadcast internal monologues, and allowed the cast to graffiti the set, all to enhance the sense of a world unraveling under the weight of its corruption. The grotesque, exaggerated elements of the production underscore the dehumanizing effects of war and ambition, making the play's themes starkly relevant to contemporary audiences.

Our goal is to create a theatrical experience that is immersive and visceral, one that entertains while provoking deep reflection on the dangers of political polarization and the fragility of power. We want the audience to leave with a profound understanding of how the relentless pursuit of power can lead to societal collapse and to see the clear parallels between Shakespeare's world and our own. To create this piece was no small feat, but we hope that the themes of dissension resonate with the audience and reflect the monster that is always around us.






